Happy New Year! Before we launch into another year, the turn of a year is a good opportunity to look backwards and to thank God for the many blessings: the great celebrations of faith, the Open Door initiative and the Alpha Course reaching out to the wider community, Father John's Golden Jubilee, the concerts, markets and fairs, the blessing of many new families from different parts of the world, the pilgrimage to Rome, and all the Christmas festivi-

Come, Holy Spirit! Give us the grace today to rise up, to open wide the doors, to go out of ourselves so as to draw others to Christ, to be disciples and to make disciples, that we may walk in your ways joyfully and build up Your Church across West Cumbria. We make this prayer through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

One of the highlights of the past year was the Mission with the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal. In simple and profound ways the Friars taught us to put into practice what we have fervently been praying for: they helped us to understand what it is to 'rise up' from our sleepiness, 'to open the doors', 'to go out of ourselves', 'to be disciples and to make disciples', and 'to walk joyfully' and 'to build up the Church'. These are not slogans which sound nice, but a daily call on our lives, a call to deeper prayer, conversion, and a commitment to grow together and to serve those who are different from us, and especially to have a heart for those who have little in our midst. Expect to hear more on this over this coming year as we work towards learning to live out our vision as a parish.

Today's Feast of the Epiphany reveals to us how even as a baby in Bethlehem, Jesus drew towards Himself peoples from other lands. Our cribs often present us with three wise men. We do not know if there were three wise men; we only know that there were three gifts (gold, frankincense and myrrh). The tradition of three wise men arose out of the belief that there were three known continents at the time, underscoring the fact that the Lord is calling to Himself all nations. St Paul writes, 'Remember you were once without the Messiah, you were all foreigners, not belonging to God's chosen people, strangers to the covenants of promise. You lived in this world without hope and without God. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near by the Blood of Christ' (Eph. 2:12-13).
