We are a week and a half away from the beginning of Lent. There is time to begin to think about how each of us might use this as a spiritually fruitful time through, stripping back what is unnecessary in our lives, dedicating ourselves to prayer and fasting, and almsgiving and works of mercy. Throughout Lent, beginning on 21 February, at St Gregory's there will be a soup lunch after the midday Mass in support of CAFOD, and a Lenten Scripture Group meeting at 7.15pm. and reflect upon the Sunday Gospels throughout Lent. Everyone is welcome to this gentle introduction to what is called 'Lectio Divina', the prayerful reading of the Word of God.

Day for Prayer for the victims of human trafficking and those who are working to combat it on Thursday 8 February, the feast of St Josephine Bakhita, who herself was captured in a village raid in South Sudan in the late nineteenth century, traumatised and tortured by various captors, until she was brought out of slavery by an Italian family who took pity on her. Their example led to her conversion to the Catholic faith and in time she became a religious sister and an awesome witness to the power of forgiveness against those who had upended her life. Today, it is estimated that 20 million people globally are trafficked illegally for use as commodities, or objects, in conditions of sexual and labour servitude.
